Back then, Hosted Phone Systems were not very reliable, Internet over Fiber was still very expensive, LED's weren't quite ready for prime time yet, and CT electricity supply rates were in the mid 11's. Things have come a long way! Premise-Based Phone Systems are mostly a thing of the past (thanks to the reliability of Hosted Phone Systems), Internet over Fiber has become more common (thanks to more companies investing in the technology, which has led to lower prices), and LED's are absolutely everywhere! CT Electricity supply rates have gone up & down over the years, but are up about 25% compared to 2010.

So what's the prediction for 2024? Energy incentives will continue to be available for things other than just lighting (such as Advanced Rooftop Controls, sensors, electric vehicle charging stations & solar solutions). Internet over Fiber optics will continue to replace Internet over co-ax & copper, and outdated Premise-Based Phone Systems will continue to change-over to Premise-Based Systems.
